David was prayed for in London a lot but through all the to and fro we forgot to have his dedication service - would you believe it...at least we managed to have one in Germany. Sorry for that!

A great cause for joy was the encounter we had with Martins sister Kirsten. She has a lot of problems, but Martin & her were able to have some very good conversations. She said, that she could sense the peace of God in us and she was longing for it too!! We prayed together for even that and know she's much closer to the Lord, as ever before! Our parents are doing well according to their ages. Martins mom is still getting a mild chemo therapy but her counts are quite good. Most of all, she knows herself in God's hand!

## Working through stuff...

The day to day life in Zimbabwe does have quite a high stress level.

Adding to that, the general situation when you come out is that: You leave behind your home, your friends and all that is known and dear to you. Your securities and your identity. You have to cope with power and water cuts.

Dogs barking and alarms going off at night.

Deeper still, is facing the suffering and a lot of things that you don't understand. And "even" missionaries ask sometime, how God can allow such things to happen.

After hearing a lot of disturbing stories in Zimbabwe too, we did feel a need to work through some of these. Our DMG made this possible at an excellent counselling place called: www. Lerucher.com. It's located near Geneva on the French side. It was a very important and liberating time, praise God!!!

It's not easy, facing suffering and other things and knowing that God has a plan with all that. But we do trust in Him, because He is the king if righteousness (Heb. 7:2) !!! He will judge the world justly one day from a white throne (Rev. 20:11)!!! This gives us hope and courage, that evil will be judged one day and good rewarded!!! We still cling to Jer. 29:11, God has a good plan for each one of us!!!

### Return to Zimbabwe...

We've arrived save and sound back in Zimbabwe and praise God for a good journey - thank you for your prayer!

David got even two (unpaid) seats from Frankfurt to Johannesburg and slept 8 hours straight!!!

In South-Africa we did another palette shopping and are now waiting for it to arrive in Zimbabwe.

Things are available here now, but prices are still not as levelled out as we expected them to be.

Thankfully our faithful gardener, security guard & part of the family: Baba Lawrence did a reasonable job with looking after the place! The rats got in a bit, but not too bad. In the car they had build a few nests, one unfortunately in the fan.. Since then we've been using lot's of scented spray in it...;-)

Praise God, we got our car fixed quickly, since we were able to buy the missing bolts in Germany & the mechanic was sober...

The termites were held back by all the deterrent we put down - praise God for that to! They did chew up a few books & cupboards in the past...

### Ministry...

We've shared on "Forgive & be forgiven" from Mat 6:9-15 & 18:21-35 in a series "Coping with difficult circumstances" in our church. It's good to be with our friends again! They missed us ( and we them) and they did fill our fridge and even put flowers on our table © What a blessing to be in Gods family!!!

Good to be with "our" kids and young folks again! What a privilege to share the Lord Jesus with them! Only he can save and lead them in the right way!!!

Thanks again, for being with us here in prayer!!!

It means a lot to us & strengthens us in our life & ministry here, even with all the difficulties.

We're looking forward to see what God is leading us into this term.
